Peace Pathways: Teaching Non-Violence in a World at War

Program Participant Expectations

The Dayton Peace Institute is the new educational arm of The International Peace Museum. The Peace Pathways: Teaching Non-Violence in a World at War is the Institute's first program offering. It is being offered for free thanks to the generous funding of the Martin Automotive Foundation. Not all of the Institute's programs will be free.

Your participation in the Peace Pathways Program is greatly appreciated, and your feedback is critical. We extend this free opportunity in the spirit of collaboration. Educational workshops and incentives will be offered in exchange for your participation and agreement to the following:

- Complete the December 3, 2022, Peace Pathways six-hour workshop (3 professional development hours) and complete the pre-and post-tests before learning sessions.
- Complete teacher surveys administered by the Museum's Peace Pathways Committee
- Create a 1 to 3 days lesson plan and explain how the student project will be classroom-implemented. Submit a project summary by March 3, 2023, to the Peace Pathways Committee.
- Take advantage of free student field trips at the International Peace Museum during the Peace Pathways Program, if possible.
- If you implement your lesson plans and student projects in your classroom or club, we ask that you administer a pre-and post-test (of your design) to participating students to evaluate your peace-themed lesson plan and student projects and administer a student satisfaction survey of the Museum's design. If your school does not permit you to administer our survey to your students, we won't require it.
- Send the Museum's photo release form home with your students to legally share photos with the Museum's Peace Pathways Committee, if possible.
- Provide student project samples with pictures throughout the process identifying images that the Museum is lawfully allowed to use for social media and foundation reports, when possible.
- Attend the Midterm Meeting on February 21, 2023, (optional for teachers who already submitted their project summary) and complete the customer satisfaction survey at the end of the meeting.

- Complete a final teacher customer satisfaction survey.
- Submit all student surveys results and pre-and post-test scores to the Peace Pathways Committee, if you implemented them in your classrooms or clubs.
- Attend the Reception on April 29, 2023, to receive your International Peace Museum Family Membership – free general admission for one year.
